Q: Am I allowed to visit a resident?

A: Yes, you are allowed to visit a resident BUT the visit has to be scheduled in advance by calling Mandy Ohman or Mary Jo Claire.

Q: How many are allowed to come to a visit?

A: We are allowing two visitors at a time per resident.

Q: Do I have to be a family member to visit a resident?

A: No.

Q: Do I have to be vaccinated to visit a resident?

A: No, you do not BUT we prefer it.

Q: Do I have to be COVID tested prior to visiting a resident?

A: No, you do not BUT we will gladly provide a Rapid COVID test at Oakview for you prior to visiting and are encouraging it.

Q: Do I have to wear a mask while visiting with a resident if I have been vaccinated?

A: Yes, please wear a mask while visiting a resident at Oakview. While there are some varying guidelines about vaccinated individuals not needing a mask, we would prefer to err on the side of caution and continue to require masks while visiting.

Q: Can I hug a resident?

A: If the resident has been vaccinated and the resident is in agreement, hugs are allowed!

Q: Do I have to stay 6 feet away from a resident?

A: If you are visiting a vaccinated resident and the resident agrees, you are allowed to be in close proximity to the resident. BUT you must remain 6 feet away from any other resident at the facility.

Q: Can a resident go on a LOA or to an appointment?

A: Yes, residents can leave the building. Keep in mind that an unvaccinated resident will have to quarantine upon return if they have had an exposure to COVID. Also, vaccinated or unvaccinated residents would have to quarantine if they exhibit COVID symptoms after an LOA.

Q: Can I visit a resident outside?

A: Yes, outside visits are permitted. Outside visits still required a scheduled appointment, screening, and limit visitors to two.

Q: Can I bring food in to a resident?

A: Single servings are permitted.

Q: If I have been vaccinated, visit a resident, and then experience COVID symptoms, do I have to notify the facility?

A: Yes! Vaccinated and unvaccinated visitors are to monitor for signs and symptoms of COVID for 14 days after visiting and report symptoms to the facility as soon as possible.



We want our residents and their families to know these important Resident Rights and Responsibilities. If you should have any questions about any of these, please don't hesitate to ask.

C (3) The facility shall inform the resident of the right to participate in his or her treatment and shall support the resident in this right. The planning process must—

- (i) Facilitate the inclusion of the resident and/or resident representative
- (ii) Include and assessment of the resident's strengths and needs.
- (iii) Include the resident's personal and cultural preferences in developing goals of care.
