
Please consider limiting your visits during our current outbreak and while Mason County remains high in transmission. If wanting to visit a resident in the COVID unit, please stop at the Nurses Station first for instructions. Visitors to the COVID unit are highly encouraged to wear N95 masks, gown, gloves and maintain 6-foot distancing. This is all to protect yourself and prevent the spread. As a reminder for all other visitation requirements, please see enclosed COVID-19 Visitor Education and Instructions.

If you have not returned the consent form yet for the COVID Booster, please do so. We cannot order the booster until the consents are returned because the boosters have a quick expiration date. We would like to get all residents boosted by the first week of May. If you have questions about the COVID-19 Booster, please call Cherie Hernandez at extension 236.

Please continue to remember to use the kiosk in the front lobby to screen in before visiting a resident. If the kiosk is not working, please sign in using our backup screening log contained in a labeled binder near the kiosk. This is a requirement for long term care facilities.

The National Moment of Remembrance, established by Congress, asks Americans—wherever they are at 3 p.m.. (local time) on Memorial Day—to pause for one minute in an act of national unity. The idea for the "Moment" was born when children were asked what Memorial Day means. They responded, "That's the day the pool opens." To make Americans more aware of the importance and values of Memorial Day, the White House Commission on Remembrance was established by Congress in 2000. The major initiative of the Commission is the National Moment of Remembrance.

The 3 p.m. time was chosen because it is the time when most Americans are enjoying their freedoms on the national holiday. The Moment does not replace traditional Memorial Day events; rather it is an act of national unity in which all Americans, alone or with family and friends, honor those who died for our freedom. In this shared remembrance, Americans can connect with each other.



Every month, we will include one of the Resident Rights or Responsibilities as written in Oakview's "Residents Rights and Responsibilities" policy. We want our residents and their families to know these important Resident Rights and Responsibilities. If you should have any questions about any of these, please don't hesitate to ask.

E. Respect and Dignity. The resident has a right to be treated with respect and dignity, including;

(1.) The right to be free from any physical or chemical restraints imposed for purposes of discipline or convenience, and not required to treat the resident's medical symptoms, consistent with 483.12(a)(b)
