Hospice Services Offered at Oakview

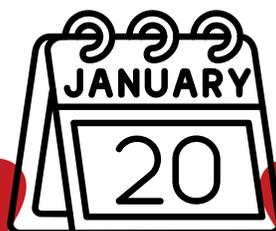
Oakview MCF has a contract with Harbor Hospice, Elara Caring Hospice, and Corewell Health Hospice to help provide end of life care if requested by the resident and/or family. Hospice assists with symptom management for comfort and quality of life. Hospice care does not take the place of the care provided by Oakview staff members but is in addition and is covered by Medicare. Resident Trust Accounts

Oakview provides a trust account option for all residents. This account is a place for residents to safely keep their money while residing at the facility. 1) Straight Talk Landline. Available at Walmart.

- Landline, Vtech Cs6114 Cordless Phone, White
- This is a \$15.00 monthly unlimited plan that is able to be up loaded online or via monthly prepaid card.



2) Frontier Land Line

For phone installation a resident/family must call Frontier at 1-888-920-9520 to set up phone service. The phone company must come to Oakview between 8:00am-3:00pm, Monday-Friday. The resident/family is to notify the Maintenance Director at ext. 237 when someone from the phone company will be hooking up the phone.

- Telephone jacks are available in each resident's room
- Telephone instrument must be furnished by the resident or their responsible party
- All costs associated with the installation, connection and use of a personal telephone are the sole responsibility of the resident or their responsible party.

Every month, we will include one of the Resident Rights or Responsibilities as written in Oakview's "Residents Rights and Responsibilities" policy. We want our residents and their families to know these important Resident Rights and Responsibilities. If you should have any questions about any of these, please don't hesitate to ask.

G. Information and Communication:

(5) The facility must post, in a form and manner, accessible and understandable to residents, and resident representatives:

(i) A list of names, addresses (mailing and email), and telephone numbers of all pertinent State agencies and advocacy groups, such as the State Survey Agency, the State licensure office, adult protective services where state law provides for jurisdiction in long term care facilities, the Office of the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman program, the protection and advocacy network, home and community based service programs, and the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit; and

(ii) A statement that the resident may file a complaint with the State Survey Agency concerning any suspected violation of state or federal nursing facility regulations, including but not limited to resident abuse, neglect, exploitation, misappropriation of resident property in the facility, non-compliance with the advance directives requirements (42 CFR part 489 subpart I) and requests for information regarding returning to the community.
